Kill or Steal

Among other issues, the State Duma of Russia focused yesterday on the destiny of Evgeny Adamov, Russia's former atomic energy minister. As usually, the LDPR stepped in with extraordinary solutions. According to Duma's deputy from LDPR Sergey Abeltsev, Adamov is well armed with the secret information of state significance. "The orange revolution in Kiev started exactly after Lazarenko [former PM of Ukraine] disclosed all state secrets of Ukraine to the Americans," Abeltsev specified. Thus, to prevent a color revolution in Russia, Abeltsev called on the deputies "to address the Prosecutor-General's Office and other competent bodies with the proposal to take immediate and most decisive actions to return Adamov to Russia." "Should such outcome be impossible, the special services must be commissioned to wipe off the atomic businessman," Abeltsev was explicit.

Luckily, not all Duma's deputies from the LDPR turned out so bloodhound. Alexey Mitrofanov suggested spiriting the former minister out of the Swiss prison. There was time, when the Soviet surveillance used to be top notch in such operations, Mitrofanov reminded.
